Glen B. Gainer III has been affiliated with the National White Collar Crime Center (NW3C) for many years prior to taking on the leadership role as NW3C's President and Chief Executive Officer in 2016. Mr. Gainer was a member of the NW3C Board of Directors since 1994 and served as Chairman of NW3C's Board of Directors for over 18 years.

Prior to becoming NW3C's President and CEO, Mr. Gainer served as West Virginia's 19th State Auditor. He was first elected in November 1992 and subsequently re-elected in the next five elections. As State Auditor, a position he held for over two decades, he served as the State's official bookkeeper, Chief Inspector and Supervisor over Public Offices, Securities Commissioner, and Commissioner of Delinquent and Non-entered Lands. Before that position, Mr. Gainer worked for the state Treasurer's Office and the state Department of Energy.

During his tenure as State Auditor, Mr. Gainer held many leadership positions on several national boards and associations, including Chairman of NW3C's Board of Directors; past President of the National Association of State Auditors, Comptrollers and Treasurers; past President of the National Electronic Commerce Coordinating Council; past President of the National Association of State Comptrollers; and member of the National Executive Committee of the Association of Government Accountants and he was also listed in Who's Who in American Politics. Mr. Gainer also served on many state Boards and Committees including Vice-Chairman of the West Virginia Consolidated Public Retirement Board; Trustee on the West Virginia Investment Management Board and Chairman of its Audit Committee; Trustee of the West Virginia Board of Treasury Investment and Chairman of its Investment Committee; Chairman of the Interstate Commerce Appeals Board; and a member of the Board of Public Works.

Mr. Gainer earned his bachelor's degree at the University of Charleston and attended the Washington Center for Learning. Mr. Gainer is also active in local church and community activities.
