In his current role, Jim successfully manages nearly twenty-five curriculum developers, e-learning developers, a multi-media specialist, specialists, developers, and instructors. Jim's team focuses on development and delivery of both in-person and online training in the areas of financial crimes investigation, criminal intelligence analysis, mortgage fraud, intellectual property crimes, identify theft, and computer-related crimes. Jim and his team utilize adult learning principles to design and develop training geared toward the law enforcement audience.

Additionally, Jim identifies and collaborates with subject matter experts (SME's) from law enforcement, academia, and the federal government to assist in the development and training of current and relevant curriculum, based on the needs of our member agencies, partnerships, and feedback from our student population.

Because of his areas of expertise and numerous years of experience, Jim also participates and has served on several national committees, which include but are not limited to the Criminal Intelligence Coordinating Council-Training Task Team & Privacy Task Team, the Bureau of Justice Assistance (BJA) Center for Task Force (CenTF) Training Program Focus Group, Department of Justice Elder Justice Initiative, and the BJA Task Force Training Focus Group.
